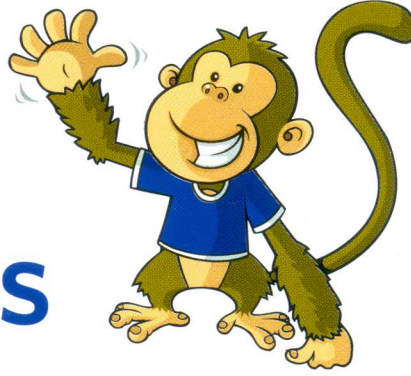

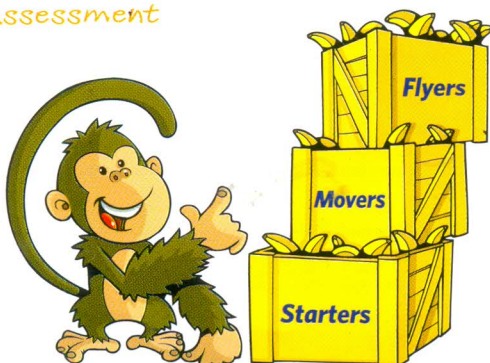
Learning English at this age gives children a big advantage. The positive experience of taking a Cambridge English: Young Learners test builds confidence and is a firm foundation for their future studies.

Three levels

There are three levels of the *Cambridge English: Young Learners* tests – Starters, Movers and Flyers – for children in primary and lower secondary education. The tests are specially designed so that children can learn in a progressive way. They start by learning simple words and phrases for Starters, and progress to using extended and more challenging language in Movers and Flyers.

Real English

The tests are skills based. This means that the focus is on practical English language skills. There are Listening, Reading and Writing, and Speaking papers (every child has an oral test with a trained examiner) so children are encouraged to use and speak English in classroom activities. This gives them more practice, more skill and more confidence.

Good fun

Our research shows that children enjoy studying for and taking the *Cambridge English: Young Learners* tests. There are many tasks such as drawing, colouring and solving puzzles, to motivate and inspire the children.

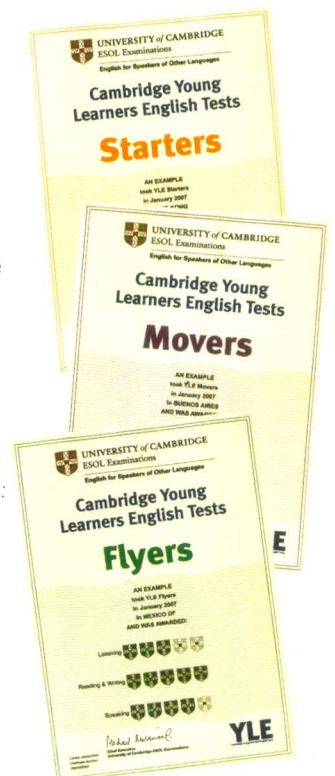
International standards for your child

The tests are aligned to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) – the international standard for describing language skills.

Cambridge English: Young Learners gives children:

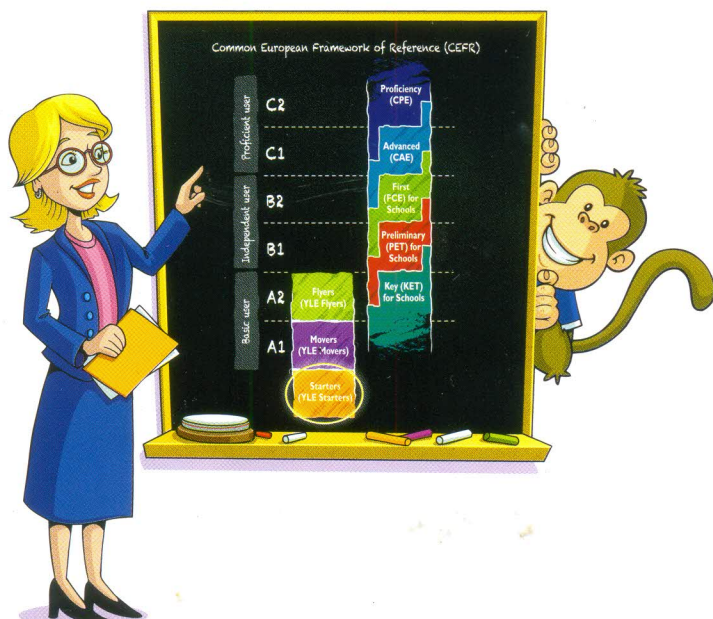
- the motivation to learn English

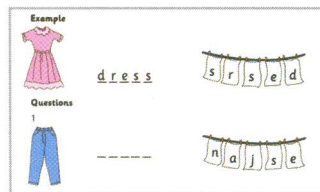
- ✓ Spend some time with your child looking at the book they are using at school

English for everyone

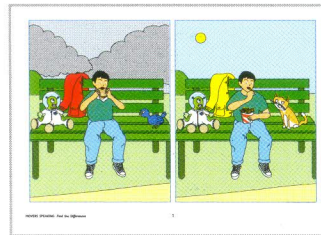

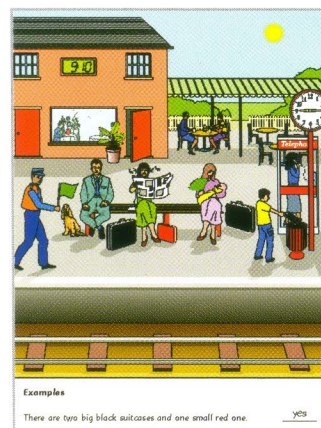

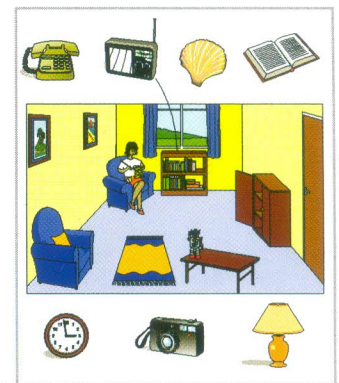

Write the words



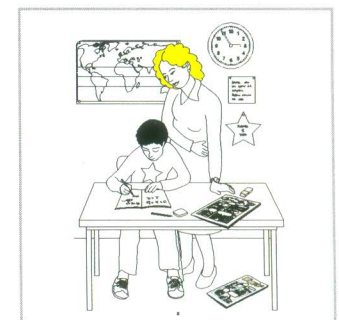
Movers Speaking
Find the differences



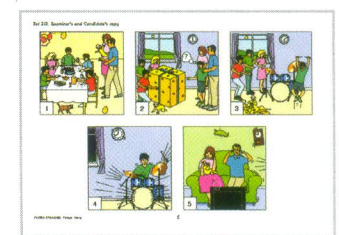
Flyers Reading and Writing
